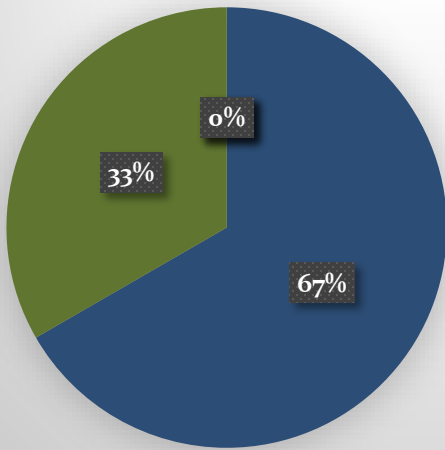

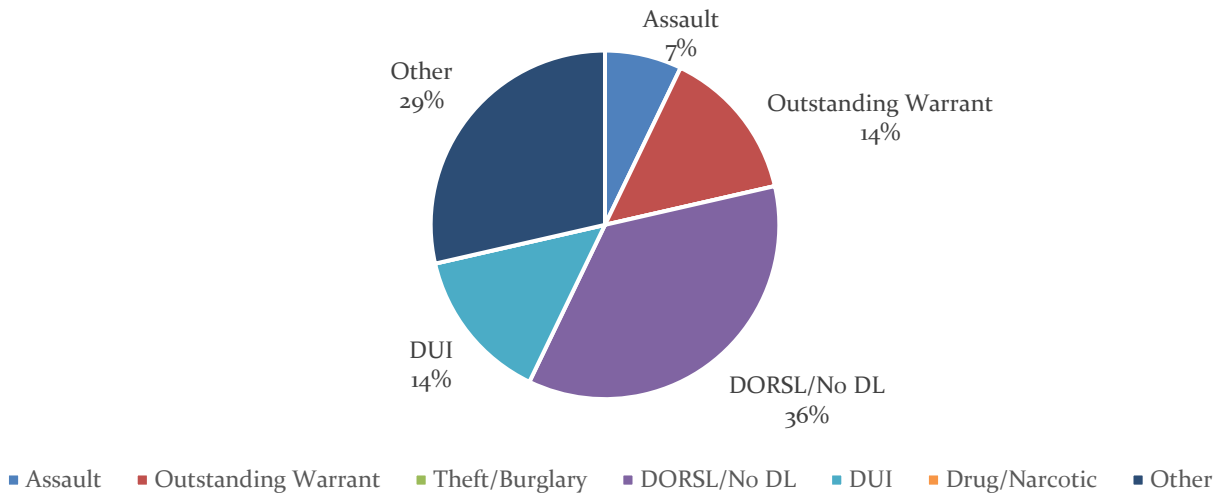

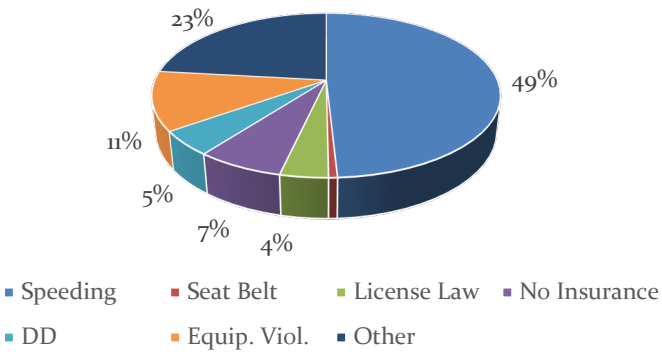
Arrest by Type



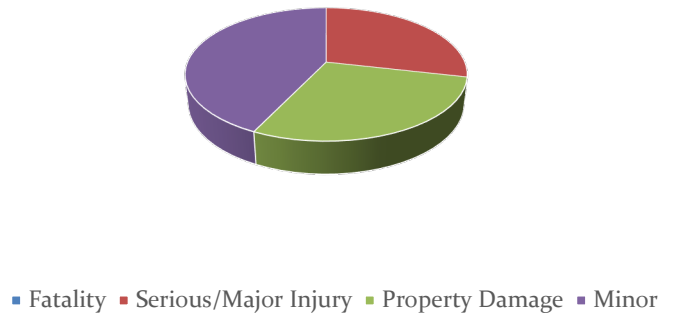

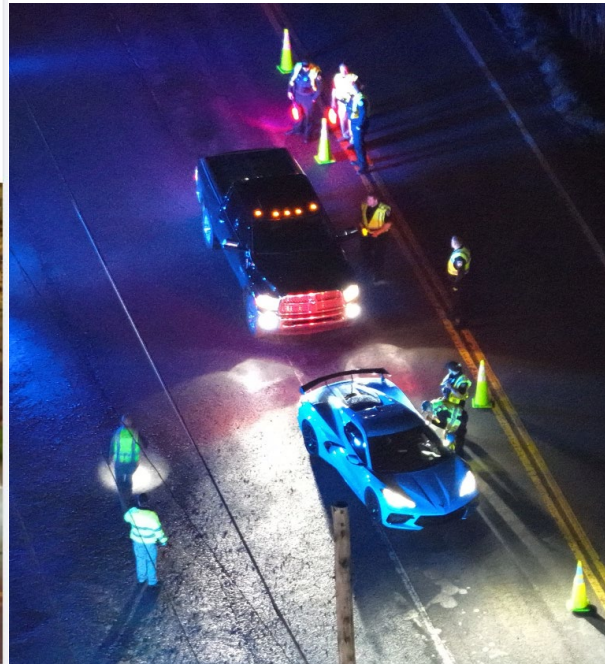
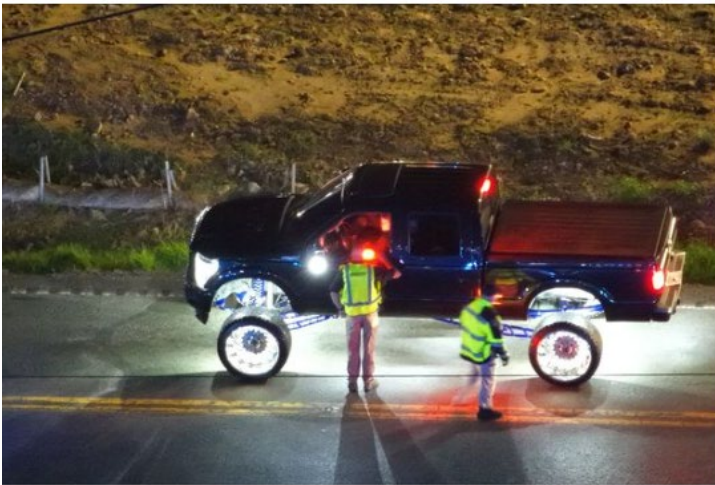
### Fentress County Checkpoint on 3/15

On 03/15/2024 The Fentress County Sheriff's Office, in conjunction with the Tennessee Highway Safety Office, conducted a scheduled sobriety check point. The check point was located at the intersection of Hwy 127 South York Hwy and Hwy 62 in Clarkrange. Agencies from across the State assisted. A total of 43 Law Enforcement Officers were on hand along with 2 D.R.E Agents (Trained Drug Recognition Experts) who are highly trained to recognize impairment in drivers under the influence of drugs. The purpose for the sobriety check point is to show that Law Enforcement is being proactive in trying to put a stop to drunk driving and impaired driving. Our goal is to keep the citizens of Fentress County and the State of Tennessee safe on our roadways and to make sure you are driving safely and buckled up. A total of 453 vehicles were checked. 14 Citations were issued along with 2 arrested for Driving under the influence and 1 drug related arrest.
