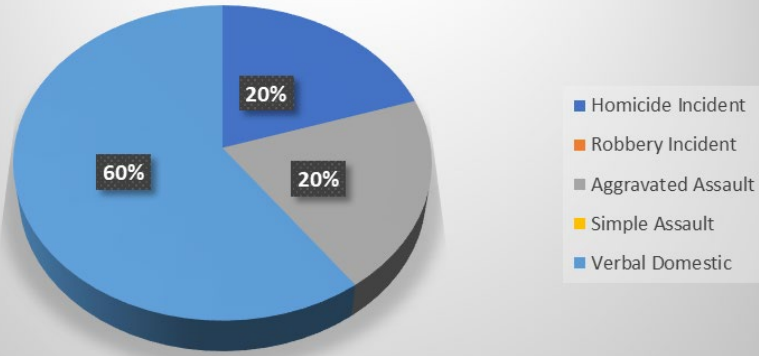

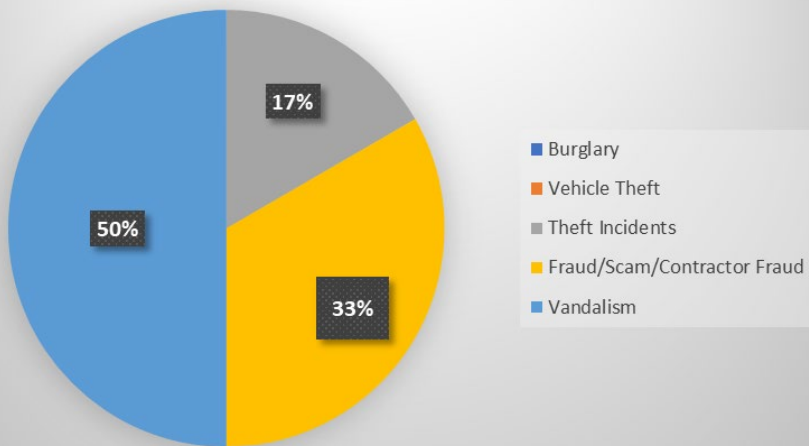

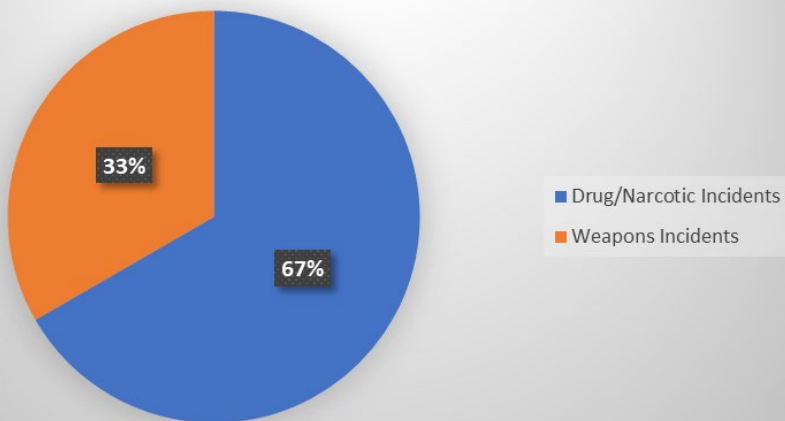
### Person Crimes Month



### Property Crimes Month

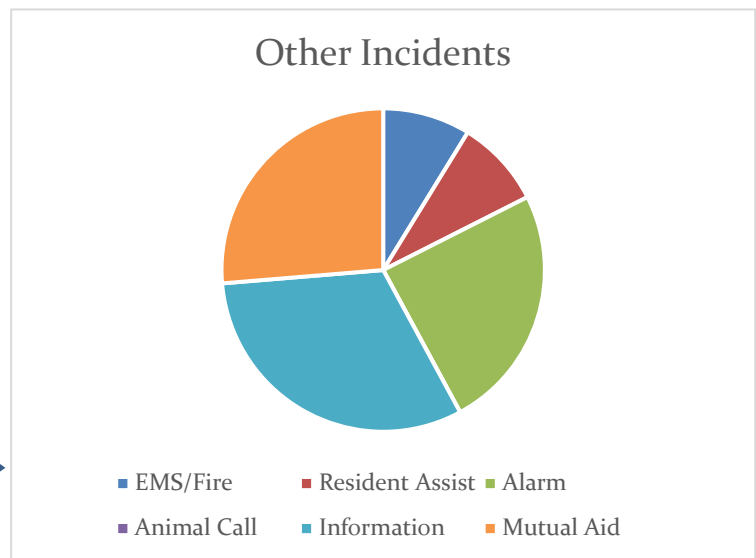
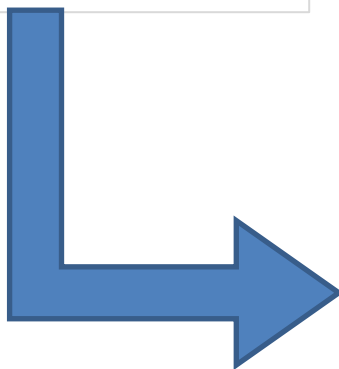
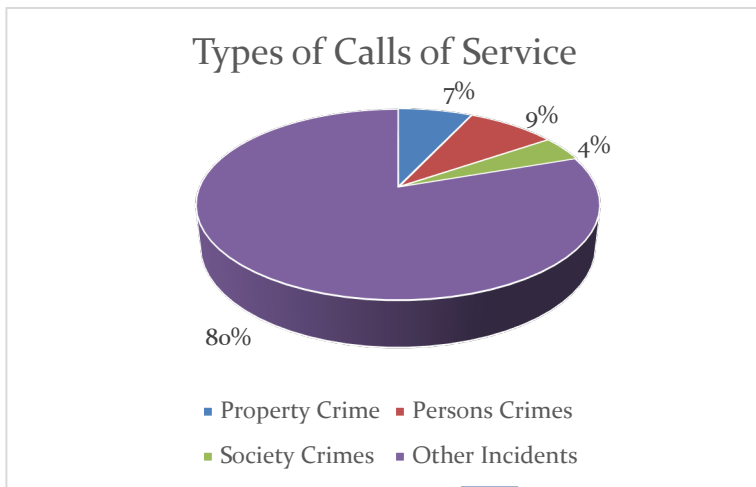

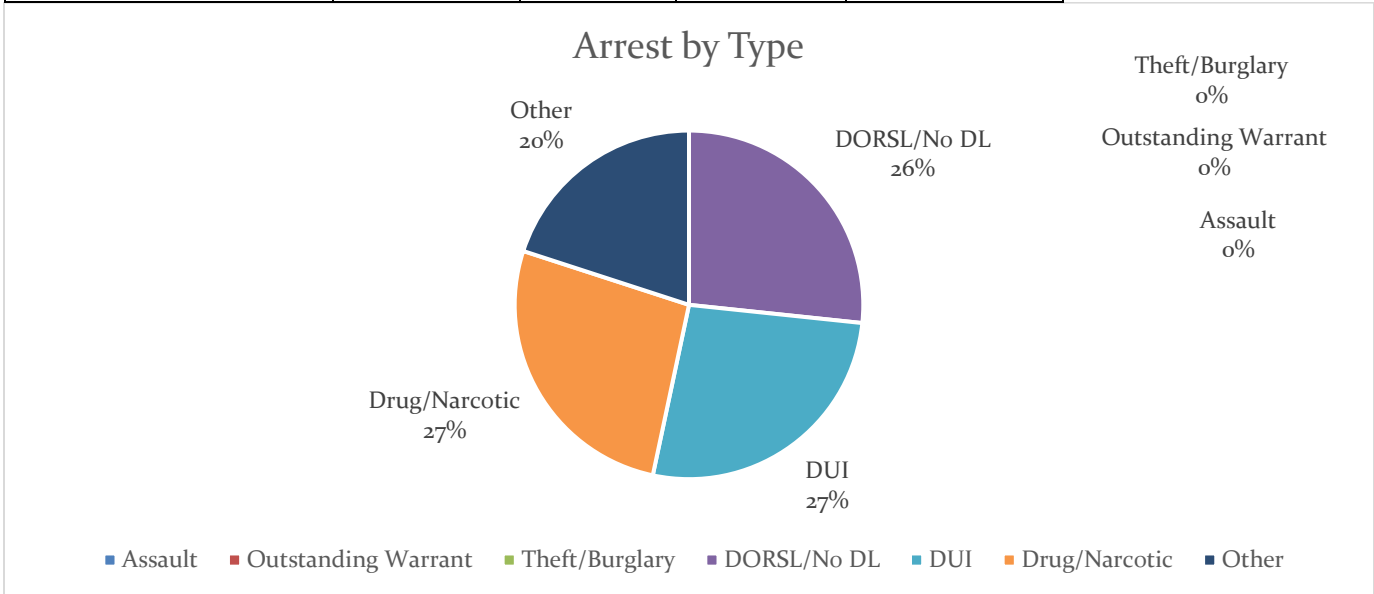

The arrest data represents physical arrests and citations issued in lieu of an arrest. The data also represents the total of offense charges issued.

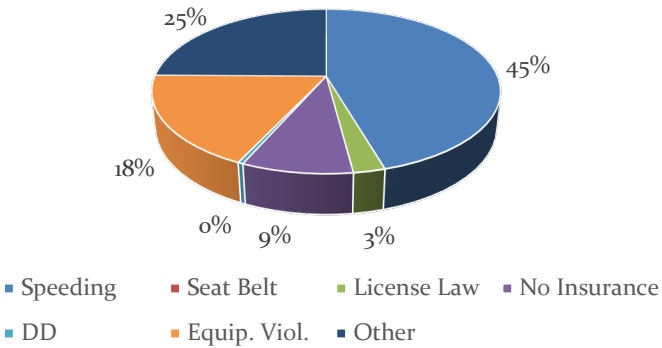

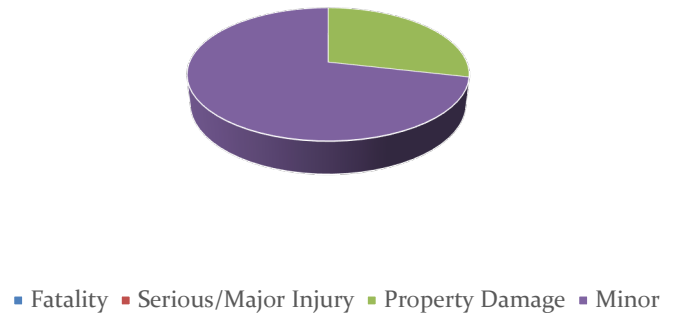

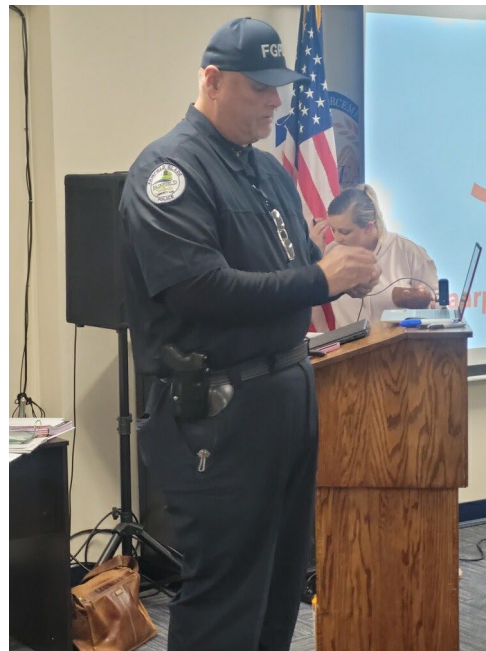
