The object of Crimes Against Property, e.g., robbery, bribery, and burglary, is to obtain money, property, or some other benefit.

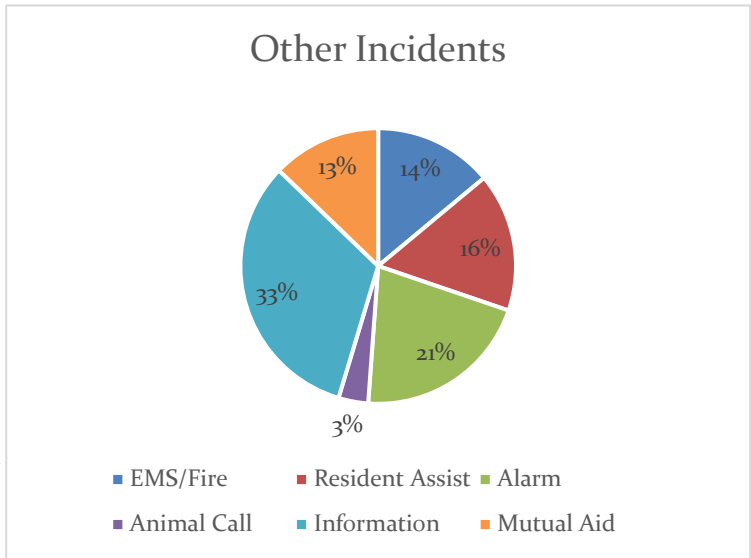
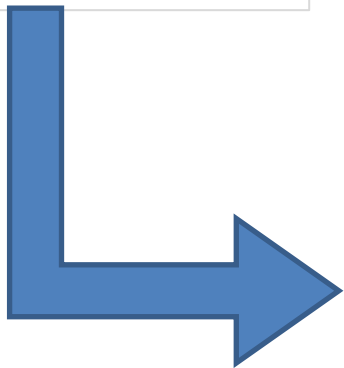
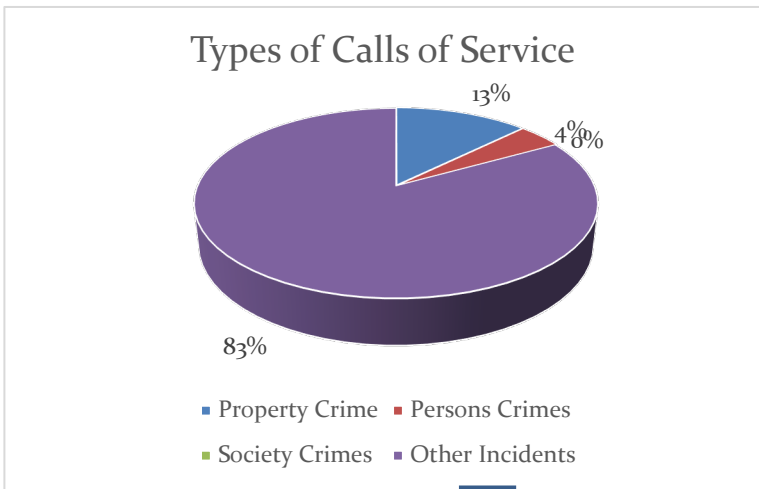

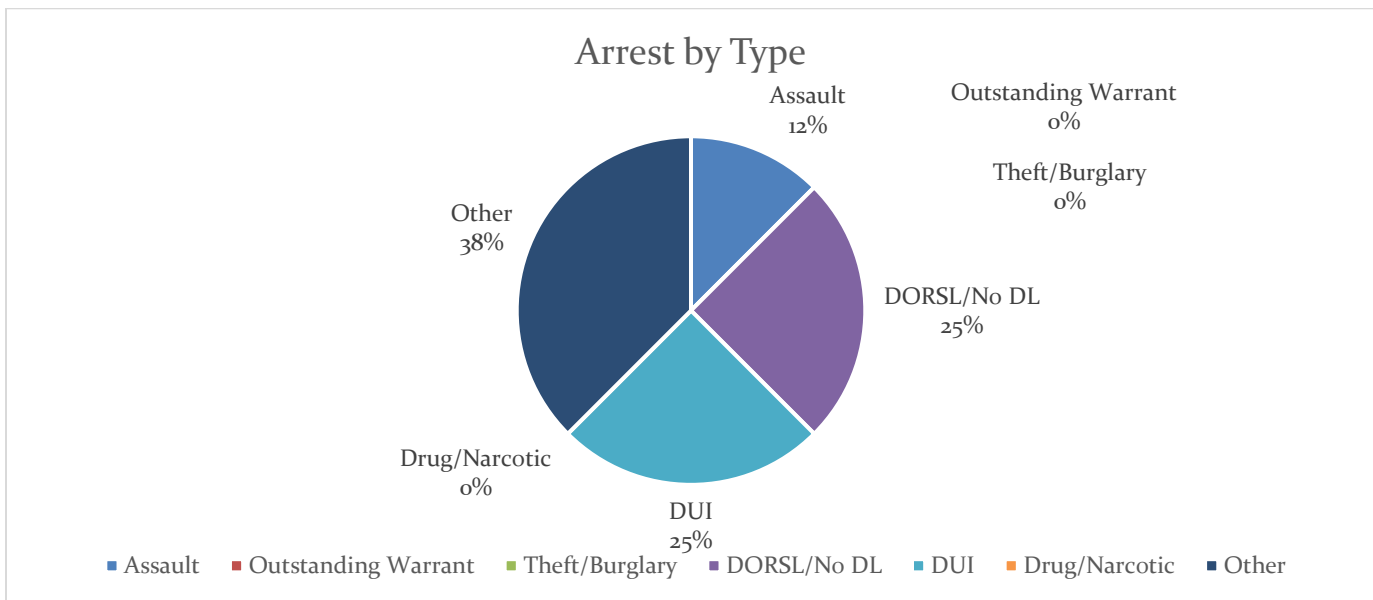

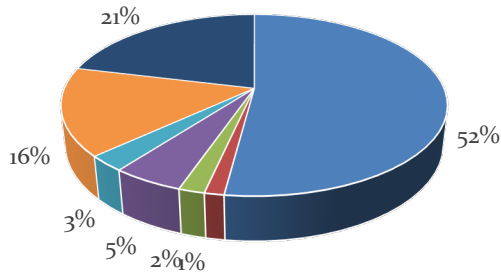

Department Highlights

- On March 18, 2023, the Fairfield Glade Police Department conducted a checkpoint for impaired drivers during the St. Patrick's holiday weekend. These proactive measures are to reduce motor vehicle accidents, remove impaired drivers, and make the roadways safe for our communities. The success of this event could not have been possible without the partnership and dedication of officers and members of surrounding agencies. Thank you to: Cumberland County Sheriff's Office, Crossville Police Department, Tennessee Highway Patrol, Monterey Police Department - Tennessee, Jamestown Police Department - TN, Cookeville Police Department, Signal Mountain Police Department, and Rhea County Sheriff's Department.
 - The checkpoint was set up on Peavine Road near Westminster Drive from 8 pm – 10 pm. A total of 269 vehicles passed through the checkpoint. The checkpoint yielded a DUI arrest with the seizure of narcotics, 8 citations for traffic violations, and 9 child car seats were inspected with 3 being replaced and installed by certified specialists.
